1. NY Forward Program Overview & Project Eligibility



NY FORWARD PROGRAM OVERVIEW





APPLY September 2024 – March 2025

- Communities prepared and submitted applications to REDCs
- REDCs nominated communities
- \circ State announced winners



PLAN April – December 2025

- Local Planning Committees are established
- Community vision and goals are refined
- Projects are identified and refined
- LPC recommends projects to State
- Participate in the preparation
 of the Strategic Investment Plan



IMPLEMENT

- Final plans are submitted to the State
- Projects are selected and awarded

ELIGIBLE PROJECT TYPES





Streetscape and transportation improvements, recreational trails, new and upgraded parks, plazas, public art, green infrastructure, and other public realm projects.



A locally managed matching small project for small downtown projects, such as façade improvements, building renovations, business assistance, or public art.



New Development and/or Rehabilitation of Existing Downtown Buildings

Development and redevelopment of real property for mixed-use, commercial, residential, not for profit, or public uses. Development / redevelopment should result in employment opportunities, housing choices or other community services.



Branding and Marketing

Downtown branding and marketing projects that target residents, tourists, investors, developers and visitors.



INELIGIBLE PROJECT TYPES + ACTIVITIES

- **Planning Activities.** All NY Forward funds must be used to implement projects.
- **Operations and Maintenance.** Funds cannot be used for on-going or routine expenses, such as staff salaries and wages, rent, utilities, and property up-keep.
- **Pre-award Costs.** Reimbursement for costs incurred before the completion of the Strategic Investment Plan and the announcement of funding awards is not permitted.
- **Property Acquisition.** NY Forward funds cannot be used for property acquisition.
- **Training and Other Program Expenses.** NY Forward funds cannot be used to cover continuous costs, such as training costs and expenses related to existing programs.
- **Expenses related to Existing Programs.** NY Forward funds cannot supplement existing programs or replace existing resources.

PROJECT MATCH REQUIREMENTS + DECARBONIZATION



- LPC can set match requirements at their own discretion (NY Forward program requires minimum 25% match for private projects)
 - * Local Planning Committee set a preferred match for private projects of at least 70%
- NY Forward program does not require a match for public or non-profit projects
- Total project cost must be a minimum of \$75,000 (except small project fund)
- New construction, building additions over 5,000 SF and some substantial renovation over 5,000 SF will be required to meet decarbonization standards

HOW ARE PROJECTS IDENTIFIED?





- All potential projects must complete a NY Forward project form through the Open Call, even if submitted in the community's NY Forward application
- The LPC will evaluate all projects based on the NY Forward Program criteria and community goals
- Not all solicited projects will be selected

- Open Call for Projects provides an opportunity for community members, property owners, and business owners to submit projects for consideration.
- All potential projects must complete a NY Forward Project Application form with required information through the Open Call, even if the project was submitted in Keeseville original application for NY Forward
- The Open Call For Projects will run from June 12th to July 25th
- NY Forward program requires a minimum 25% match for private projects
- Local Planning Committee set a preferred match for private projects of at least 70%
- The total project cost must be a minimum of \$75,000 to submit a Project Form.
- Projects <\$75,000 should submit a Small Project Fund Interest Form to demonstrate support for the fund.
- Not all solicited projects will be selected

The Hamlet of Keeseville has been awarded funds through the New York State NY Forward (NYF) program to fund catalytic projects in the downtown to spur revitalization. The Local Planning Committee (LPC) is seeking project proposals from the public for potential projects to be included in Keeseville's Strategic Investment Plan. Projects included in the Strategic Investment Plan will be reviewed by New York State and may receive funding from a total allocation of \$4.5 million. Project proposals must be received

Small Project Fund Interest Form

Do you own a business or property in the Hamlet of Keeseville's NY Forward program boundary (below)?

Do you have a building or business in need of smaller-scale improvements such as interior and exterior renovations or permanent equipment acquisition?

The Small Project Fund is a type of NY Forward project that could help fund a range of improvements in a downtown, such as building improvements (e.g., facades, interior fit-out, HVAC, etc.), business assistance (e.g., permanent equipment acquisition), or public art.

For the Small Project Fund to be included in the slate of proposed NY Forward projects submitted to the State, it is important to document interest in it. The Hamlet of Keeseville's Local Planning Committee is seeking letters of interest from business and/or property owners to show that there are property and/or business owners interested in participating in this program.

However, submitting a letter of interest does not guarantee that a community will apply for a Small Project Fund as part of NY Forward. The project sponsor (e..g, the municipality or business improvement district) will also have to demonstrate interest and capacity to implement a Small Project Fund. NYS DOS Guidance

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Project Title

The project title must begin with an actionoriented statement and should succinctly describe the "what" and "where." Project titles must:

- Begin with an action (Transform, Expand, Establish, Renovate, Build, Create, etc.)
- Name the outcome if applicable (Public Plaza, Job Training Center, Small Project Fund, Mixed-Use, Housing)
- · Name the location if applicable (Historic Edwards Building, Historic Cannon Building, Long-Vacant Historic Buildings, Corner of Main & Clinton, 78 Bridge Street)

DRI/NYF Funding Request and Total Project Cost

Each project profile must state the requested amount to be paid by DRI/NYF funds, the total project cost, and the percentage of total costs requested. It is expected that the DRI/ NYF funding request for private projects will represent just a component of the overall project budget. The total project cost should reflect costs paid for by DRI/NYF funds, as well as private equity or financing, tax credits, or other public funding or financing. Those sources of additional funds should be listed in the project budget.

HOW ARE PROJECTS EVALUATED?



The LPC will evaluate all submitted projects based on the NYS NYF Program criteria and goals and local goals:

- **Eligible Project.** Projects must be one of the eligible project types.
- Alignment with Local and State Goals. Projects must advance the goals established by the LPC and align with the State's program goals
- <u>Catalytic Effect.</u> Projects must have a significant positive impact on the revitalization of downtown Keeseville.
- **Project Readiness.** Projects should be well-developed and ready to proceed as soon as possible upon the award of funding.
- **Cost Effectiveness.** Projects must represent an effective and efficient use of public resources.
- **Co-Benefits.** Projects must result in benefits to the community, beyond just the project developer, such as: additional economic activity and improved quality of life.
- **Community Criteria.** The LPC may set additional criteria for their review (LPC #2 discussion)

FINAL SLATE OF RECOMMENDED PROJECTS



- The Final slate of projects takes into consideration <u>feedback from</u> <u>the public</u> and is <u>finalized by the LPC</u>
- NYS will make final decision on projects selected for funding
- The total amount of requested NY Forward funds will have a higher dollar amount than what will be awarded (\$6 \$8 million)
- Projects included on the Final Slate of Projects are not guaranteed to be selected for funding



- All awards are provided as a <u>reimbursement grant</u>. Project sponsors must complete work before monies are provided
- Project sponsors will likely need to secure bridge financing to cover costs while project is being completed
- All awards are subject to <u>State requirements</u>, including MWBE goals, competitive procurement, etc.
